

Why Wetlands?

Wetlands provide a myriad of benefits to Delaware's citizens. They provide habitat for wildlife, reduce flooding by absorbing excess water, clean our water by breaking down chemicals from pesticides and fertilizers, and provide recreational and education opportunities. One acre of wetlands can hold up to 330,000 gallons for water to a depth of one foot. More wetlands equals less flooding and loss of property.

Delaware's Wetlands

Over 30% of Delaware is covered in wetlands. About a 1/3 of that is tidal, while freshwater wetlands make up the remainder. Currently, state law only protects tidal wetlands, leaving over 30,000 acres of wetlands unprotected.
