SUMMARY STATEMENT:

Incumbent will be responsible for assisting scientists and technicians engaged in collecting, recording, analyzing, and reporting information related to fisheries management.

EMPLOYMENT PERIOD:

One full time seasonal position with a maximum term of six months.

Three part time seasonal positions with a minimum term of six months, not to exceed 29.75 hours/week.

NATURE AND SCOPE:

Incumbent will be supervised by a scientist and is responsible for collection of data in both laboratory and field settings. Work may also involve operation and routine maintenance of boats, vehicles, and laboratory and field equipment. Duties will be assigned within well-defined guidelines.

PRINCIPAL ACCOUNTABILITIES:

- 1. Assists in collecting data from laboratory analyses, field sampling, and scientific surveys.
- 2. Assists in fish aging methods.
- 3. Assists in processing biological samples.
- 4. Operates and maintains boats, vehicles, and laboratory and field equipment.
- 5. Assists in data entry.
- 6. Assists in maintenance/repair of buildings and equipment shops.
- 7. Performs related work as required.
