
Models of Politics

① Institutional - U.S. Government is supreme law of the land.

- Federalism

- Checks & balances by 3 branches of govt



② Process

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- ① Identify problem - citizen complaint
- ② Set Agenda - columns in mass media
- ③ Formulate policy - White House
- ④ Policy legitimization - Congress
- ⑤ Implementation - Cabinet Departments
- ⑥ Policy evaluation - At budget time

Policy is evaluated annually during
the budget process


③ Rationalism - Policies are set for maximum social gain.

④ Economic - Policies are set when programs are cost-effective.

Benefit > Cost

$$B/C > 1$$

⑤ Incremental - Quite simply, govt programs expand annually and incrementally



DE Budget increases
3% annually.


⑤ Group Theory - public interest ^{12/} groups

A shared attitude group that makes certain claims upon other groups in society.

Republicans - "


⑥ Elite Model - Preferences of the governing elite

Concepts

- People are apathetic and ill-informed.
- Few should have power, many shouldn't have power.
- Best example - Monarchy

⑦ Public Choice Theory - Individuals come together in the political arena and the market place for their own benefit, to pursue their own self interest. But they can mutually benefit from collective decision-making.

Good example: Thomas Jefferson believed in enlightened self-interest, written in Declaration of Independence. This led to a U.S. Constitution to protect life, liberty, and property.



⑧ Game Theory - two or more people
make choices and outcome depends
on choices

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Consider the game of chicken



Driver A

Stay on
course

Veer

Driver B	Stay on course	A: -10	A: -5
	Veer	B: -10	B: 5

Driver A	Stay on course	A: +5	A: -1
	Veer	B: -5	B: -1

Assumes that opponents make rational choices

Examples: Brinkmanship: • One ~~less~~ bridge
• Nuclear Deterrence

• Saddam WMD Iraq

Since most opponents are rational, this explains
why terrorism not more widespread.

Terrorism: Opponents are irrational, do not consider costs, no deterrence.
