

AWRA DE Chapter Bylaws Comments

Lorraine Fleming:

Regarding the dues structure at some point you may wish to have a retired professional rate, although I don't think that needs to be in the bylaws.

Jerry Kauffman:

Here is how the NJ section become a federally tax exempt non-profit corporation and got state sales tax exemption:

- Form a nonprofit Corporation by documenting it's creation in writing; Constitution & By-laws.
 This must include the wording that IRS wants to see for non-profit state.
 - This must include the wording that IRS wants to see for non-profit status; "...organized exclusively for scientific, literary and educational purposes ...".
- Register the Corporation with the State Commercial Recordings
 Division as Nonprofit entity
 (Corporations certify their existence through the State they are located in)
- A Certificate of Incorporation, nonprofit is then on file at NJ State and a Business ID # is issued
- 4. Obtain a Federal Taxpayer Identification number from the IRS
- Apply for Federal Recognition of Exemption under Section 501(c)(3) and a determination letter from IRS (Form 1023)
- 6. Apply to NJ Division of Taxation for Sales Tax exemption

Finally - Use the NJ State issued Form ST-5 for purchases to be exempt from Sales Tax within New Jersey only
