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Background


- Fenceline Communities or Environmental Justice Communities.
- Residential areas in close proximity to industrial facilities and major sources of pollution.
- Predominantly low-income
 Black and Latino families.



State of the Air:

- American Lung Association's ground-level ozone pollution ratings by county:
 - New Castle: F
 - Kent: B
 - Sussex: C

What Is Ground-Level Ozone?



- Also known as smog.
- Produced by chemical reactions between sunlight/heat and emissions from vehicles, power plants, refineries, and other industrial pollution.
- Extremely toxic for people and the environment.

Impacts

- Seven communities in New Castle County have higher risks of cancer and respiratory illnesses compared to Greenville and Delaware as a whole.
 - All seven communities predominantly Black and Latino.
 - o Greenville predominantly white, wealthiest in Delaware.
- Result of consistent presence of chemicals including formaldehyde, benzene, and acrolein.
 - All classified as carcinogens

Impacts Continued...

- Children are the most vulnerable to the effects of fenceline pollution.
 - Home and school typically in same community—constant exposure to polluted air.
- Approximately 3,000 school-age children who attend schools and live within one mile of "high risk" chemical facilities.
- Cancer rates 55-74% higher, respiratory hazards 81-125% higher than Greenville students.
 - Kuumba Academy Charter School (Southbridge) cancer and respiratory risks 3x higher than Greenville.

Environmental Justice Legislation



Justice 40 Initiative

- Biden Administration policy
- Environmental Justice
 Communities must receive at least 40% of benefits from federal investments.
 - Climate change, energy, workforce development, affordable housing, pollution reduction, water infrastructure.

Delaware's Justice 40 Oversight Committee



- House Concurrent Resolution 40
 - Passed in June 2021
 - Chair: Rep. Larry Lambert, Co-Chair: Sen. Marie Pinkney
 - Regular meetings with community members, state and local officials, etc. to identify needs of the community, crafting policies to meet their needs.
- House Bill 259—Wireless Emergency Alerts
 - Result of 2018 Croda chemical leak— updated emergency alert protocols for leaks/fires/explosions that threaten public health and safety.
- House Bill 466—Environmental Justice Permits
 - Amends construction permit approval process to prevent further degradation and pollution in Environmental Justice Communities.
